#### **Latest News on ProLogis/Kmart Warehouse**:

The K-Mart building demolition permit has been issued, but no demolition scheduled yet. The Bureau of Development Services (BDS) is continuing to review the building permit. PBOT has allowed an exception to the standard driveway width, which will enable 18-wheelers to turn in and out from 122nd, close to the high and middle schools (Exception ruling 22-131685). Please consider emailing PBOT to ask why this exception was allowed and make them aware of safety concerns for students.
