What's Happening @ Riverwood

Recreation Committee is planning a Sack Lunch get-together!!! January 29th at 2:00 PM in the RW Rec Room! We're asking people to bring a sack lunch for themselves. The committee will provide coffee and tea AND will offer play time with games of Dominoes, 10,000, or peoples' choice! Bring your lunch and join us for some conversation, with games afterwards!

<u>Parking Committee</u>: Just as a reminder, parking in the driveways and in front of garages when not loading or unloading is not allowed in our rules. It is often a burden to your neighbors and can prevent people from entering and exiting their garage. Elise Morgan is available by phone if someone needs a new parking pass or has questions about parking.



We still have a vacant position for a volunteer Parking Chair.

<u>Maintenance:</u> **D40 repaving:** complete. Budgeted at \$45K, final cost \$42K; thus we saved \$3000. **Sewer Issue in Dwy 40**: The 2nd major sewer issue in D40 is another 20-25 feet of main 6" line leading to the street that requires replacing due to heavy root clogs into old concrete pipes.

Water Main Issues in Dwy 70: Two water-line breaks under D70 pavement with enough flow to overload the street drain. D70 was back online after 23 hours. Part of the reason for the breaks was poor installation of the line replacement, a project of 20-30 years ago.

Insurance Committee: Plumbing here at Riverwood is often very old. When it breaks, whether it is in the crawlspace or within the patio fence, it is the Homeowner's responsibility to repair. Please make sure you have enough insurance to cover your home (at least \$100,000, per the Riverwood governing documents) and that it is condo or HOA-type insurance. Repairs are expensive, so you might also think about having someone inspect the plumbing in your crawlspace, as a preventative measure. Riverwood HOA insurance is for the common areas. Please be aware of the difference. If you have questions, please contact Jann Gilbert.

<u>Welcome Committee</u>: *Riverwood Manual Updates* – With the Riverwood website ready to be unveiled in the near future, it has created the opportunity to review some of the documents for updating. These two documents have been updated: 1) the ABCs of Riverwood and 2) Recycling. You will find both attached to this newsletter.

Most of the recycling document is directly from https://www.portland.gov/bps/garbage-recycling/recycling which will be your ongoing, official site to answer any recycling questions.

Some non-recyclable items are often put at the curb. This is a reminder that **these items DO NOT GO IN THE RECYCLE BINS: plastic bags, clamshells, styrofoam**. These materials need to go in the garbage can or be recycled at places other than our curbside bins.

Garbage: With our East County wind and neighborhood wild animals and birds, containing garbage for Thursday morning pick up has increasingly become an issue. *It is strongly recommended that all residents use a garbage can with a lid that can be secured*. If your can does not have a lid that can be secured, please use a bag in your can and tie it closed, so that the contents of the can do not end up scattered about. Your driveway neighbors will be grateful.

Oregon Community Solar Program: Here's a chance to go solar without putting panels on your roof! A



new state effort, the Oregon Community Solar Program (oregoncsp.org), now gives homeowners and renters the COMMUNITY SOLAR option to source energy from small solar farms throughout Oregon on their existing utility bill and at a discount. The

program connects PGE and Pacific Power customers to solar energy projects without having to install panels on their own roofs. There is no cost to sign up, participate, or cancel and consumers are to be incentivized for participating. This incentive is received as a credit directly on your bill simply by joining the program.

<u>Sad News</u>: Tragically two pedestrians have been killed in Argay Terrace in the last 90 days. The latest death occurred at NE 141st and Sandy Blvd on Dec 19th. ATNA board members continue to work with ODOT to try to improve safety along Sandy Blvd. Consider calling PBOT at 503-823-7233 and request safer streets in Argay Terrace.

<u>ProLogis/Kmart Warehouse:</u> Neighbors for Clean Air (NCA) continues to advocate with the City of Portland to get off-site impacts evaluated prior to permitting this warehouse project. In addition to increased truck traffic adjacent to Parkrose High School, ATNA and NCA have grave concerns about the air quality impacts on Argay and Parkrose residents, as well as students.
