Argay and Parkrose community members are in a discussion with Prosper Portland and the Portland Housing Bureau about setting up a Tax Increment Financing (TIF) district, TIF is the new name for Urban Renewal. Before your eyes glaze over: Pop Quiz! Which is a true statement?

- A. Once tax base is frozen, 3% percent of the taxes on assessed property values that increase over the next 20-30 years go back into the district
- B. 45% of that 3% must be spent towards supporting affordable housing.
- C. City of Portland has set aside \$1.2M for East Portland TIF exploration that will be presented to council Fall 2024.
