Committee News

From the Board: Dues Increase: The Board voted to increase dues by \$20/month. A formal letter was sent giving 30 days notice. If you did not receive this letter, please reach out to the Board. The monthly HOA fee increase will take effect on July 1, 2024. Please get your monthly fee to the Treasurer (Monique) by the first of every month, as this affects RW's cash flow and ability to pay bills.

Landscape Committee: ***Mosquito Alert!!***We've been told it's going to be a bad season for mosquitos. Here are a few plant selections that will help keep them away: Plant basil, lavender, and rosemary to repel the mosquitoes. They hate any of the three. Place a pot by your doorway or on the path to the garden. This is an easy way to deter them, and you get fresh herbs, too.

- **Crystal Greens** (our landscape company) is helping to get DW 60 ready for painting by doing building clearance. We will continue throughout the complex. I know some bushes are looking leggy, but we are trying to let them grow back to a natural shape, then make trims. Thank you for your patience. Happy Summer!
- If you have plants that look stressed, please give them a drink! Thank you, Riverwooders!!
- **Notice**: It's that time of the year when everything is overgrown and ready to be trimmed back. Look at your patio: if any plant or tree is touching your home, fence, gutter or your neighbor's property...it needs to be trimmed ASAP.
- A gentle reminder that it is not our landscaper's job to clean up your cuttings from your patio. You need to feed it into your garbage can or use the craft paper bags and put them out with your garbage. It may take a week or two–or your neighbor might have room in their can and might help out.
- Fund: A BIG "THANK YOU" to everyone who is helping us grow our Landscape Bottle Fund. Please continue to bring your RINSED, returnable cans & plastic bottles to Board Meetings and Social Events. Or contact someone on the Landscape Committee to arrange drop-off or pickup.
- Please send your ideas for garden areas needing attention to your Landscape Driveway Representative (see Roster for names). Photos of the area will help, along with your suggestions.

Editor's Note: Here at Riverwood, leaks in common areas are addressed by the Maintenance person or Board Member with Maintenance Oversight. Leaks in our homes or patios are the Resident's responsibility. Please look for leaks on your property and get them fixed!!! If you think they could affect Riverwood's water bill, contact Monique (Treasurer) to look into getting a refund from the Water Bureau.

Also, please turn off water when not in use. Examples: brushing teeth and washing cars. Unless you are actually using the water, please <u>DO NOT</u> let it run! <u>Please do not wash the cars of friends or visitors!</u> Where ever possible, please conserve water. The City adjusts water rates annually on July 1. Last year the water rates increased by 7.9% and another rate

increase is only weeks away. Please be mindful of your water use!!

Anonymous: Please remember that Residents are responsible for retrieving their recycling bins from the curb in a timely manner. If you are out of town, ask a neighbor to do this favor for you.

You can 1) report an aircraft noise event, 2) listen to alerts or 3) leave a message for Noise Office Staff. I left a message and my phone number. They did not respond. 5 tactics imposters are using and how to help avoid them (from Bank of America):

- 1. "They said to ignore those warning messages." Transaction messages exist to help protect your account hang up if told to ignore.
- 2. "They needed remote access to 'fix' my computer." Don't grant access to your computer or devices. You could reveal personal information and lose your money.
- 3. "I thought I scored really hard-to-get tickets." Research sellers before buying anything. When it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.
- 4. "The rental home we paid for never even existed!" Research the owners. If a rental listing has different names or if you're told to wire money, it's likely a scam.
- 5. "They told me to lie to the bank." If you're told to lie to your bank about why you need to wire money or make a withdrawal, it's probably a scam.

Take a minute before you react: Don't disclose codes, passwords or account information. (We'll never call to ask for those.) Take your time — don't let anyone rush you. Always verify any request for money.

Steady As You Go: Falling is NOT a normal part of aging! What causes imbalance? Decreased vision (eye), decreased strength (muscles), aging balance system (ear). Too many falls? Falls are the leading cause of accidental death and injury in people 65 and older. 33% of older adults fall annually and only 1/2 talk to their doctor about it! Find the cause – Talk to your doctor! Get screened for BPPV (benign paroxysmal positional vertigo): crystals in your inner ear can get dislodged, but this can be corrected!

Falls Prevention: 1) Medical: visit your doctor for a checkup, have your eyes examined, make diet & lifestyle changes. 2) Balance: exercise, such as yoga or tai chi, physical therapy. 3) Safety: use proper support, such as a cane, walker or handrails; use proper lighting; use proper eyewear and footwear. Thank you to those who attended the Urban Renewal/Tax Increment Financing District discussion at the fire station on Wednesday, May 22nd! We heard from Prosper Portland about what benefits being a TIF district can bring to the area as well as an eye-opening presentation about the financial health of Parkrose School District and how a TIF district may negatively impact their operations. Lawyers from CRAG went through them and condensed the findings which were then presented to ProLogis. It's now up to ProLogis, and Commissioner Rubio's office, if they want to find ways to be a good neighbor and address community concerns. The Land Use Board of Appeal case continues. If you think construction noise is too loud, please call 311 to file a noise complaint.
