
Looking for Something?

Styrofoam Recycling: Green Century is now offering styrofoam and plastic recycling to residents through our public drop-off and businesses. The styrofoam, EPS and expanded polystyrene are ground up and densified into blocks, which are then manufactured into plastic products such as picture frames, TV and computer cases, office equipment and other products. All this is done right here in the Pacific Northwest. Drop-off is located at 2950 NW 29th Ave, Portland. The fee is \$10 per 45-gallon bag. We ask that you sort your plastics by type. We cannot accept dirty styrofoam. Please, no after-hours dumping. Thank you. Green Century.

<u>Slow Down on NE Rose Parkway.</u> Neighbors on NE Rose Parkway are fed up with both the increased amount of traffic and the inconsiderate drivers who speed down their street to avoid the speed bumps on NE Fremont. They have filed a formal request with PBOT to add speed bumps to NE Rose Parkway as well. If we wish to avoid having speed bumps on every road in Argay, let's make a collective effort to slow down on roads where kids are playing, dogs are being walked, and neighbors are out getting exercise.

Additionally, please consider that the speed bumps on NE Fremont are designed to be driven over at 20mph and you don't need to slow down to 5 mph, or less, to get over them. Finding a balance between speeding up a bit on NE Fremont and slowing down on NE Rose Parkway can make traveling through our neighborhood a more pleasant experience for everyone.

Curbside Battery Recycling: Getting rid of old batteries just got a lot easier! The Portland Bureau of Planning and Sustainability (BPS) has launched a new service to collect and recycle batteries. Residents living in houses, duplexes, triplexes, or fourplexes can now recycle their batteries by placing them in a one-quart bag and setting it out with their glass recycling.

This new service addresses the rising problem of battery-caused fires at recycling and waste facilities. Portland Fire Marshal Kari Schimel



emphasized the importance of safely disposing of lithium-ion batteries, which are a growing fire-safety concern nationwide. These batteries, often found in e-scooters, e-bikes, and portable electronics, can start and spread fires quickly, emitting large amounts of toxic smoke. It is critical that Portlanders do not throw these batteries,

and devices containing them, in the trash. For more information, visit the Portland Bureau of Planning and Sustainability website here.

<u>Prologis Construction</u>: Construction continues and a lawsuit with the Land Use Board of Appeals is underway. <u>CRAG Lawyers</u>, representing <u>1000 Friends of Oregon</u>, <u>Neighbors for Clean Air</u>, and <u>Northwest Environmental Defense Center</u>, have filed their brief. The city and Prologis have 21 days to file theirs (late July). The Land Use Board of Appeals will consider and rule sometime in August. Meanwhile, CRAG lawyers are proposing a settlement with the City and Prologis to improve pedestrian safety around the site and lessen the impacts of future operations.

<u>Giusto Farm Reopening</u>: If you enjoy farm-fresh vegetables, <u>Giusto Farm stand</u> at 162nd opens in July. <u>Spada U-pick and stand</u> is open at 158th, and <u>Tanager Farms' CSA</u> delivers to Level Beer every Thursday. Sign-up is required.
