Landscape Committee: > We are moving forward with a Lawn Restoration Plan. It will cover all our lawn areas, green spaces and homeowners lawns. It includes Aeration & Lime application, with Overseeding to fill in bare spaces and to enrich our lawns. > As a Committee, we have decided during leaf season to have our leaves placed on all the bare dirt, flower bed spaces. By bare I mean beds that need more nutrients to feed the soil. You may see flags or poles planted to indicate where the leaves should go. > We have reached out to a few homeowners that were in violation of our Landscape rules. We've had positive responses from half of them and will continue to follow up with the last two. > Another spot in Riverwood has been beautified. > It is time to divide your perennials...enjoy the beautiful weather in your gardens!



Speed Bumps Coming to Rose Pkwy: Speeders on NE Rose Parkway have ruined it for everyone. Rose Parkway neighbors, justifiably tired of drivers going too fast down their street, complained enough to PBOT and have spurred them into action. By now many neighbors have received the mailed letter below from PBOT stating speed bumps will be installed sometime between Fall 2025 and Spring 2026. White lines spray painted across the

street indicate the future locations of speed bumps between NE 122nd and NE 141st. Enjoy a smooth ride home (at the posted speed limit, please) on that street while you can because it's about to get bumpy.
